Fees & Policy Agreement

Registration Fee/Deposit Policy

Registration fees and deposits are nonrefundable

\$49 one-time administrative fee which includes free t-shirt and afternoon snacks

A non-refundable \$50 deposit per child per week is required to secure spot at time of registration. The remaining weekly fee is due 3 days prior to the start of camp your child is attending.

Payment Policy

I understand that payment is due 3 days prior to the camp start date.

I understand if payment has not been made, I shall not bring my child to camp.

Late Payment./Return Fee Policy

I understand that if my bank or creditor returns my payments for any reasons, I will be charged \$10.

Cancelation Policy:

No refunds or credits will be given or processed for the non-refundable deposits for camps weeks enrolled, membership, registration deposit, unused scheduled days, absences, disciplinary actions or removal.

Refund Policy:

Refunds will not be issued for reason for personal schedule conflict or change of plans. Restrictions due to medical reasons will require documentations.

Attendance: I understand I am responsible for payment of all weeks registered,, whether my child attends or not. I also understand that my child can not attend of payment has not been made.

Snacks

E3 Modern Learning will provide snacks for all children in the morning. The snacks will be consistent per day of the week and provide campers with nutritional energy.

Sack Lunches

Our full day programs require parents/guardians to send along a nutritious bagged lunch each day. Lunches are not to contain peanuts or nut products.

If a lunch is forgotten, a camp coach will attempt to contact parent/guardian to provide a lunch.

Campers will not be permitted to share or trade lunches.

Walks Excursion/Field Trips

Young Scholars enjoy fresh air and explore their community and nature walking is all part of 21st Century MODERN curriculum. Parents are asked to grant permission by filling out appropriate forms during registration. Changes to this decision must be made in writing.

Staff

Each program room will be staffed by a certified teacher or otherwise approved staff of equivalent background. All staff members provide a criminal reference check, CPR and E3 Modern Learning policies and procedures.

Safe Arrivals & Departures

To ensure the safety of all children attending our camp, parents/guardians are expected to come into camp when dropping off and picking up their child each day. This will allow for staff to be aware of child's whereabouts at all times.



Inform Staff of Absences

If your child is scheduled to attend camp and is unable to because of illness or another reason a call needs to be made to the camp director at (402)578-7613 or send a message on the moments app.

No refunds will be issued because our fees allow a space to be reserved for your child. If it is a prolonged illness and payment has been received, written doctor's note must be submitted to the office. All fees are allocated to the substantial operating cost of the program that are planned well in advance.

Emergency Protocol

In the case of a real fire or other natural disaster the following actions will be taken:

1. Move children to a safe location (fire safe location is church parking lot; natural disaster bathroom remain there until it is safe to come out.)
2. Contact parents of young scholars at Reunification of parents with their children in the event of an emergency that requires evacuations.

Illness/Injury

Any participant should remain home from all programs if they have had any of the following in the past twenty-four(24) hours:

- Fever (100 degrees or higher without fever reducing medication), diarrhea, vomiting, sore throat, undiagnosed rash, chicken pox, pink eye, ring worm, head lice, or any other potentially contagious condition.
- Physical injury that does not allow the participant to safely participate in program activities.
- If a participant demonstrates any of the above while at the program, the parent/guardian will have one hour to pick up the participant from the program location.
- If the participant becomes sick while at the program, he/she will be separated from the other participants while waiting for pickup.

Asthma & Emergency Medication

Campers can carry their own asthma medication or emergency medication with the parent's permission for the child to self-administer ie. Antihistamines, epinephrine and medication but will be in the possession of the child. Authorization for the Administration of Medication Form must be completed in advance by the child's parent(s). When the child procedures described in the Individual Anaphylactic Plan. They will complete and sign the chart on the form.

Prescription Medicine

Medication may only be taken by children with the written authorization from the parent or guardian. The medication must be in the original container clearly labeled with the child's name, name of medication, date of purchase, expiry date and instructions for storage and administration. **NO OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS will be administered.** When possible we encourage medication be given at home. Forms for administration of drugs are available at each campsite. They must be completed and signed before medication.
